family sailed to Canada and America, living for a number of years in Battle Creek, Mich., finally moving to Marion, Ohio. When Dr. Bull was seven years old her father died. In 1882 Elder D. K. Lindsay held meetings in Marion and thus they first heard the message of Seventh-day Adventists. Later they attended camp meeting which was held in Marion. She and her daughter were baptized at a camp meeting in Cleveland by Elder Lindsay in 1890. Maud was graduated from the nurse's course at Battle Creek Sanitarium in 1893. She received her doctor's degree in 1901. Dr. Bull delivered some 9,000 babies in the Marion area. This missionary-minded doctor spent many thousands of dollars helping students to gain an education in church school, Mount Vernon Academy, and college, some of whom are active workers in the church today. The Monnett Seventh-day Adventist Church school is a monument to her belief in Christian education. After having Sabbath School in the home for a number of years, Dr. Bull bought the oldest church in Marion on North State Street. It was largely through her efforts that the building now in use on the same property was built in 1929. She now rests from her labors in the blessed hope of the resurrection.
