### Veteran Worker Dies

Elder John Frederick Crichlow died May 13, 1963, at the Riverside Sanitarium in Nashville, Tennessee.

Elder Crichlow was born in Barbados, British West Indies, March 12, 1865, where he received his formal education. He gave up preparation for the Methodist ministry to become a Seventh-day Adventist. He served as a colporteur in the islands of Barbados, Monservelt, Trinidad, St. Keits, and other Caribbean areas.

Elder Crichlow continued the colporteur ministry after coming to America. In 1912 he was called to the ministry and worked as a pastor in Tennessee and California. In 1915 he returned to the Southern Union where he served as pastor and state secretary of the colored
